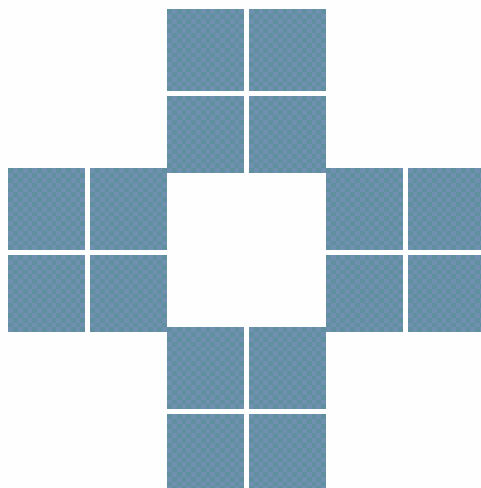

NOVEMBER 20-22, 2002**

The John A. Hartford Foundation has generously invested in a major program entitled “Building Academic Geriatric Nursing.” The focus is on developing geriatric nursing leaders and scholars who will advance the quality of health care available nationally to older adults. Under the direction of Dr. Claire M. Fagin, the American Academy of Nursing provides the overall coordination and administration of this exciting program. One feature of this program is the annual opportunity for shared leadership development, whereby all scholars and their mentors interact with the members of the Advisory Committee, several of whom are the directors of the five Hartford-funded Centers of Geriatric Nursing Excellence (CGNEs), and those committed to gerontology through other Hartford-funded initiatives, e.g., the two MBA scholars recently selected as part of this program, the seven schools selected for the “Nursing School Geriatric Investment Program,” and the AACN program scholars (Geriatric Nurse Practitioners and Clinical Specialist). The overall goals of the leadership conference are to:

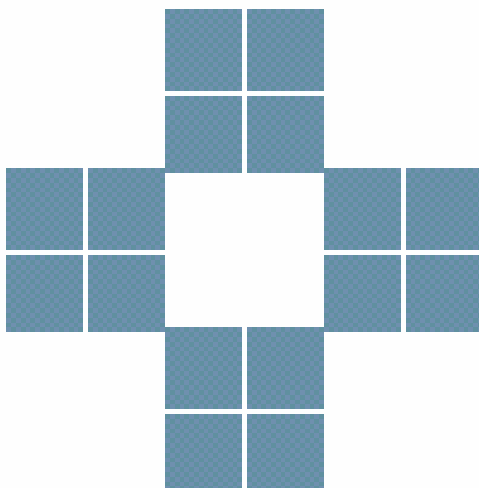
- Assist the scholars to orchestrate full careers;
- Facilitate skill training necessary to build excellence and leadership in gerontology;
- Encourage the development of a national network of geriatric nurse researchers and leaders; and
- Link research to practice and policy changes.

Meeting these goals provide the conceptual framework for a pre-conference activity in conjunction with the annual meeting of The Gerontological Society of America (GSA) in order to encourage the aforementioned networking. This leadership conference uses core leadership competencies—risk taking and creativity, interpersonal effectiveness, strategic vision, and inspiring/leading change—to frame the content, and features a range of leaders with various perspectives to focus these skills on policy issues in geriatric nursing.

Born and reared in South Gerard, Alabama, Dr. Mary Starke Harper began her career as a student nurse at the Tuskegee Institute. After receiving two degrees from the University of Minnesota, she became director of Nursing at the Tuskegee VA Hospital. During her long career with the Federal Government, Dr. Harper



worked in hospitals and taught in universities around the country. Along the way, she received a Ph.D. from St. Louis University and became known as the nation's leading authority on mental health and long term care, serving as advisor to four U.S. Presidents. Dr. Harper's tireless efforts with legislation, curriculum development, and federal funding helped establish minimum requirements for quality, long term health care. In 2001, the Geriatric Psychiatry Center in Tuscaloosa was named in her honor. Dr. Mary Starke Harper has dedicated her life to improving this country's healthcare delivery system. She has represented the State of Alabama with grace, and consistently credits her success to the values she learned in rural Alabama.
